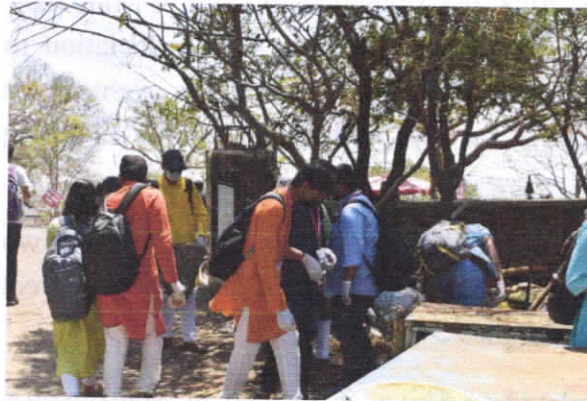
On the occasion of Ram Navami, 30th March, 2023, the Technosmart Club of MIT-ADT University had arranged a Plogging Event at Bhuleshwar Temple with association to SCCN. Students and Faculty from various branches had participated in this event. From MIT College of Management 9 Students with 1 faculty participated in this Plogging Event.

It was a memorable and a great event headed by Dr. Rajani Sajjan from MIT-SOE. Two Buses left the college at 9:30 am. We reached the venue around 11 am. It was a great journey towards a holy place like Bhuleshwar Temple.

The Bhuleshwar Temple, a Hindu temple related to Shiva, is located in Maharashtra, India, around 10 kilometres from Yawat and 45 kilometres from Pune. The temple was constructed in the eighth century and is perched on a hill. The walls are decorated with classical carvings. It has acquired the title of protected monument. Panch Pandava is believed to have constructed the temple in Hindu mythology. The Bhuleshwar Temple's Jirnodhar was completed in 1230 AD, during the Yadava Rulers.



After reaching there we started the plogging event as instructed by Dr. Rajani Sajjan. The temple is clean and neat from the front but there were many dumps at the backside of the temple. We all were divided in groups and started walking and collecting the litter.



After cleaning the litter we had a delightful Prasad provided by the temple committee. On such a holy place having prasad was a memorable thing for all of us.

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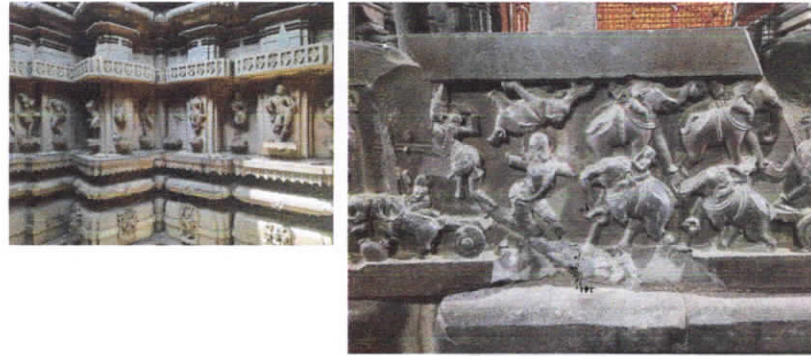


After having such a delicious prasad we went into the temple for Darshan followed by a felicitation program. It was a very fortunate moment for us to join our hands for Aarti of Lord

Shiva at such a holy and spiritual place. We felicitated the Respected Pujari of the Temple who told us many interesting facts of the Bhuleshwar Temple. He told us how the Temple became a protected monument. Due to the temple's secret entrance, which is reminiscent of the Gaimukhi Buruj architecture from Shivaji's time, it is thought that the temple was destroyed by Muslim invaders and afterwards rebuilt. The temple is located on a fort known as Daulat Mangalgad Fort. Due to its outside resemblance to Islamic design, such as its circular domes and minarets, it appears more like a mosque than a temple. The walls are decorated with classical carvings.
